The Museum will host a Reception & Gallery Talk with the artist on Sunday, February 17, 2018 at 3pm with the Gallery Talk beginning at 4pm.

The Tributaries exhibition series began in 2008 with the goal of supporting underrepresented and underrecognized metal artists with solo exhibitions at the Museum. Along with the exhibition, Tributaries artists travel to the Museum to present a gallery talk or slide lecture and some artists elect to teach workshops in the Museum's smithy, foundry or small metals studio. With over 35 Tributaries exhibitions completed or in the planning process, the Museum has celebrated some of the most talented artists who are shaping the metals field today. The Metal Museum actively collects the work of these artists to document the early and evolving stages of their careers.
